## **OUR STORY**

The Colours of Calcutta Foundation is a Spanish NGO that began a **development cooperation programme** focusing on **health and education** in the **Pilkhana slum in Calcutta** (India) in 2005.

Colours of Calcutta is the brainchild of **Antonio Mesas**, who came to Calcutta to work as a volunteer with the Missionaries of Charity and decided to stay on to begin this project. In the early stages he worked with a small group of people and in 2005 they formed the "Un Ladrillo en Calcuta" Association. They then began collaborating with the **Indian NGO Seva Sangh Samiti**, founded in 1968 by the French priest Father Laborde, whose life was recounted by journalist Dominique Lapierre in his book "The City of Joy". They remain our partners in the area to this day.

The first initiative to be launched was a protection home for girls, Anand Bhavan, which opened in April 2006. One year later we took on the management of a medical centre in Pilkhana, expanding services each year. In 2011, the latest project was launched: a women's craft workshop. These projects continue to operate today and they integrate our development cooperation programme.

In October 2009, Antonio Mesas received the **Cross of the Order of Isabella the Catholic** from the Government of Spain in recognition of his work. In 2010, the project was integrated into the Ananta Foundation, taking the name "Colours of Calcutta, development cooperation programme", and has continued to progress over the four years since.

In late 2013, Colours of Calcutta embarked on a new phase, becoming the **Colours of Calcutta Foundation on the 13th of December**. It registered with the Ministry of Health, Social Services and Equality and the AECID (Spanish Agency of International Cooperation for Development) as an NGDO (Non Governmental Development Organization) in the first quarter of 2014, with the aim of creating a structure that will ensure **the sustainability of the projects in Calcutta**, using all the experience gained from the work of these past **nine years and adding new initiatives** for the implementation of future projects.



## MISSION AND VISION

## **OUR MISSION**

Provide **development opportunities** to people living in situations of **extreme poverty** in order to improve their living conditions.

## **OUR VISION**

- Working for development means **believing in people**, in their capacity for action and transformation, when they have the resources and opportunities to develop this capability.
- We believe that the **development of a community** happens through the development of its people and their active participation.
- We believe in children as a driving force for development. By attending to their **health needs** and **access to education**, we try to provide them with the opportunity to develop their capacity for transformation.



## INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

#### DEVELOPMENT COOPERATION PROGRAMME IN INDIA

Our projects focus on the development cooperation programme we carry out in Calcutta (India). Our role in this programme concentrates on:

#### IMPLEMENTATION, MANAGEMENT AND EVALUATION IN THE FIELD

In order to do this, the Colours of Calcutta Foundation has two people in the field: Antonio Mesas, India director (and founder of Colours of Calcutta), present all year round, who performs the roles of management, supervision and monitoring, and María de Muns, director in Spain, who travels to Calcutta twice a year to provide technical support in the management and evaluation of the projects.

#### Local counterpart: Seva Sangh Samiti



We work in collaboration with the Indian NGO Seva Sangh Samiti, which was founded in 1968 by Father Laborde, on whose story the book "City of Joy" by Dominique Lapierre was based. Seva Sangh Samiti has 46 years of experience in the Pilkhana slum in Calcutta (India) where our projects are located.



The majority of the team who work on the projects (51 local staff) are natives of the area who have received the necessary training for their work. This helps enormously in terms of our awareness of the needs of the community, our understanding of the difficulties we encounter and the relationship with the beneficiary families, who in turn become the driving force for the development of their community. Local professionals have also joined the team over the years, bringing their knowledge and experience from different fields (health, education ...) to contribute to the development of their people.

This has allowed the programme to adapt to the needs identified in the community over the 9 years, so that every new initiative stems from a genuine identified need. The result of which is that we now find ourselves with a programme which is fully integrated into the surrounding community.


#### **SUSTAINABILITY**

We work towards the sustainability of long-term projects, aiming to improve the training of the local team to meet the challenges of the day with regard to management and funding, promoting self-funding initiatives and obtaining resources within India.

#### **FUNDING**

The Colours of Calcutta Foundation is one of the main funders of the projects which make up this programme. For this reason, our work in Spain focuses on raising funds through the collaboration of members, private donors and organizations, and various activities and events are held throughout the year.

We also have the support of Amici Colours of Calcutta Italia ONLUS, our sister organization in Milan, and the Fondazione Petrini in Switzerland.



## PILKHANA, "THE CITY OF JOY"

Calcutta has an estimated population of over 15 million people of which it is estimated that more than 5 million live below the poverty line. Many of these people live in large slums located near industrial settlements. Our project is located in one of these slums, Pilkhana - better known as the "City of Joy" - in Howrah, an industrial district of Calcutta.

Pilkhana is one of the largest slums in Calcutta and has a precarious infrastructure, with more than 100,000 inhabitants who live in conditions of extreme poverty. Many of the inhabitants of this area are migrants from rural areas of the same state of West Bengal and the neighbouring state of Bihar, who came to the city in search of work. The families are large, with the extended family living together in order to try to cover the needs of its members, given the lack of public social welfare. The families" incomes are low and unstable, deriving from makeshift jobs, and are often less than €1 a day.

Health is affected adversely by the harsh living conditions and a public healthcare system without the adequate resources for the high population density. We also found a high rate of illiteracy among parents and this affects parenting standards and the children's development. Moreover, public education is not free, which makes access to education difficult for many of the children of the area.

# PILKHANA MEDICAL CENTRE COMMUNITY HEALTH PROGRAMME

#### PROGRAMME START DATE: 2007

The Pilkhana medical centre was inaugurated by Seva Sangh Samiti in 1976 and since then it has operated on a continuous basis, having become fully integrated into the community. Our team began collaborating with this centre in 2006 when it was on the brink of closure due to a lack of resources. The building was renovated and a new phase began with its reopening in January 2007. Since then, the number of patients and services has been increasing every year.

#### **BENEFICIARIES**

Children and adults of all ages are seen in the medical centre: inhabitants of the Pilkhana slum as well as other slums which are further away (Tikiapara, Belilius Road, Batra, Dasnaghar), as it is one of the few centres of its kind in the area.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- Provide **basic health care necessities** that will improve the overall health of families in the slum.
- Carry out health **promotion activities** aimed at the **prevention and early detection** of diseases, to ensure greater speed and efficiency in the treatments.



## **PROJECTS**

#### PRIMARY HEALTHCARE

We provide basic healthcare necessities which are accessible to families in the community through the following services:

#### **Departments:**

- General Practice: Monday to Saturday
- Pulmology: Monday, Wednesday and Friday
- Gynaecology and obstetrics: Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday
- · Paediatrics: Monday, Wednesday and Friday
- Physiotherapy: Monday to Saturday
- Treatment room: Monday to Saturday
- Dental Clinic: Tuesdays and Thursdays. Launched in 2014.



#### **Pharmacy:**

The medications prescribed by the doctors are provided free of charge and we acquire them via the Community Development Medical Unit. This organization specializes in the sale of generic medicines to NGOs, so quality is ensured.

#### Diagnostic testing:

Although the centre does not have the equipment for diagnostic testing, we have an agreement in place with Lakhotia Centre, a diagnostic centre in the area.

#### TUBERCULOSIS CONTROL PROGRAMME

Tuberculosis is considered one of the major health epidemics in India and is widespread among children and adults. The medical centre is part of the network of **Directly Observed Treatment (DOT)** centres, designated by the central government as part of the campaign to control tuberculosis and which **provide treatment to patients free of charge.** 



#### SUPPLEMENTARY NUTRITION PROGRAMME

This programme reinforces the treatment of TB patients by providing them with a **nutritional supplement** every other day. This consists of a breakfast with a high nutritional value which helps in their treatment.



#### **VACCINATION CAMPAIGNS**

Our centre facilitates access to the vaccination campaigns carried out by the government, keeping mothers informed and supervising the children's vaccination records. Some public vaccination campaigns, such as that of Polio, are carried out by health workers who use our centre to reach the children.



#### **HEALTH EDUCATION WORKSHOPS**

**Prevention** is one of the cornerstones of the intervention. In 2014, we continued our monthly health promotion workshops within each of the departments, targeting mothers in particular due to their critical role in the families' health.



#### OPENING OF THE DENTAL CLINIC IN AUGUST

On the 12<sup>th</sup> of August, we opened a new department: a **Dental Clinic**. This was made possible thanks to the collaboration of the *Indian Women's Charity Association* of Madrid, who contributed the amount required for the equipment, and the impetus and guidance of Dr.Luis Jane from Barcelona. DVD Dental also donated materials.

### MEDICAL CENTRE CASES

#### Tithi, a case of cleft lip

Tithi is a child with a cleft lip that came to our facility at 8 months old. Our team facilitated the intervention in Mercy Hospital in August where Tithi underwent the first surgery successfully and is waiting for the second next year.





#### Axana, learning to walk

Axana is 8 years old and was born with cerebral palsy. Every day she comes to the medical centre for physiotherapy to advance her independence and in 2014 she began to take her first steps with the help of her mother.



#### Sanjeev, recovering from tuberculosis

Sanjeev is 25 and works as a rickshaw driver in Pilkhana. He contracted tuberculosis and this prevented him from working to be able to support his family. In 2014 he received treatment in our hospital and is now recovered.



#### Surmila, physiotherapy unit

Surmila is 67 and as a result of very tough living conditions and various ailments in her bones could barely walk. She receives physiotherapy treatment in the medical centre and has been provided with a walking stick so that she can get around independently..



## NUTRITION

### PROGRAMME FOR CHILDREN WITH MALNUTRITION

#### **PROGRAMME START DATE: 2007**

This programme operates within the medical centre. It began when the centre reopened in 2007 with a day unit which was limited to 16 places due to reasons of space. In 2008 we expanded it with the launch of the weekly care programme, enabling us to treat roughly 80 children simultaneously. This has meant that since then we have been able to treat every child who has presented at the centre with malnutrition.



#### **BENEFICIARIES**

Children up to 2 years of age suffering from malnutrition.



- Treat child malnutrition.
- · Reduce child mortality.
- Counter the **effects of malnutrition** on child development.

#### **PROJECTS**

#### 1. Day unit for children with malnutrition:

Accommodating 16 children, priority is given to those who arrive in a state of severe malnutrition or with an **extreme family situation** which makes proper treatment at home difficult. They receive care from Monday to Friday and are in the centre from 10am to 3.30pm. They are looked after by two nurses and two carers. In addition, the mothers are given the milk they need for feeds at home.



With space for around **65 children aimed** at those with mild, moderate and severe malnutrition. The children attend once a week for a pediatric review and weight check and they receive the milk they need for the whole week.







## NUTRITION

#### COMPREHENSIVE TREATMENT OF MALNUTRITION

The treatment lasts from the birth of the child until that child reaches age 2, receiving comprehensive treatment consisting of:

- **1. Medical care:** Detection and monitoring by the medical team (paediatrician and nurses).
- **2. Nutrition:** Breast milk is an indispensable source of nourishment to the baby in their early life. For this reason, we encourage breastfeeding within the malnutrition programme. In many of the cases that present, breastfeeding is insufficient due to the condition of the mother and so it is necessary to combine breast milk with formula.
- **3. Physiotherapy treatment for children of the day unit and the weekly programme:** Malnutrition affects the child's development, and in particular their psychomotor development. For this reason, all children who need it receive treatment in the physiotherapy unit of the medical centre.
- 4. Workshops on health education and parenting guidelines for mothers: Workshops are given once a month where issues focusing on parenting guidelines (breastfeeding, vaccination, nutrition, hygiene...) are addressed. The aim is that mothers learn to care for their children so that they can take responsibility for their role in the upbringing of the child and prevent the child becoming malnourished again after the treatment.

## CASES STUDIES

### OVERCOMING MALNUTRITION

#### Md.NAJAR: day unit

Md. Najar came to us in March 2014 in a state of severe malnutrition. He was treated during the year in the malnutrition unit and has made some progress, but needs to continue with us next year to recover fully.





#### FARZANA: treatment ended in 2014

Farzana came to the day unit in 2013 as a 1 year-old with grade 2 malnutrition. Her treatment continued in 2014 and was coming to its completion at the end of the year so that she can join the nursery for the next academic year.





## FROM THE NURSERY TO SCHOOL

#### IBRAN AND Md. SAHADAN

Both came to the malnutrition programme's day unit in 2010. They became best friends and went to the nursery together once they had recovered in 2012. In January 2014 they started school in one of the schools in the district.





## EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

#### NURSERY

#### **NURSERY START DATE: 2007**

The nursery is located within the medical centre. It was launched in 2007 upon the centre's reopening.



#### **BENEFICIARIES**

Forty boys and girls from 2-5 years of age. We prioritize those children who have completed their treatment in the malnutrition programme and those who have no one to care for them during the day, so that they will not be out on the street.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- Provide basic care to improve the overall health of the child: **nutrition**, **hygiene**, **medical care**.
- Provide **preschool education** that contributes to the psychosocial development of the children and prepares them for their subsequent schooling.
- Help them **enrol in school** at the age of five.



#### **PROJECTS**

The children attend the nursery from Monday to Friday from 10am to 3.30pm. Through our projects we aim to provide them with a comprehensive care that contributes to the development of each child.

#### 1. HEALTH:

- **Hygiene:** the children do not have toilets or running water in their homes. To maintain proper hygiene the children shower each day upon arrival at the nursery.
- **Nutrition:** they receive 3 meals a day breakfast, lunch and a snack. Their diet is monitored by the paediatrician so that their basic food needs according to their age are met.



- Medical care: the nursery is located within the medical centre and children receive the care of the centre's paediatrician and nurses.
- Child yoga classes and physiotherapy: The children have yoga class three times a week, which contributes to their psychomotor development. In addition, the children who require individual treatment receive physiotherapy.



## EARLY CHILDHOOD FOUCATION

#### 2. PRESCHOOL EDUCATION:

The nursery has two classes with two different teachers, divided according to age: 2-3 year olds and 3-4 year olds. We have an educational programme for each of the classes adapted to their ages. We also go on outings twice a year with the children to the zoo or the botanical garden. This is to encourage contact with nature, as there are no parks in the slum and the children have no open spaces in which to play.



#### 3. EDUCATION ASSISTANCE:

We work to raise awareness among families of the value of education for their children. When the child turns 5, the age to start school, we help the families with the admission process in the public schools of the district. We also fund the first year of school through grants which cover all tuition, uniform and book expenses.

#### 4. EDUCATING THE MOTHERS:

The teachers, nurses and doctors hold group sessions with the mothers each month. Health issues are addressed along with the importance of education for the children's development.

#### **FDUCATION**

# ANAND BHAVAN Protection home for young and adolescent girls

#### START DATE: 2006

Anand Bhavan, which in Bengali means "The House of Joy", is a protection home that has been in operation since April 2006, providing boarding facilities to young and adolescent girls. The girls are provided with a safe environment in which to grow and develop, a comprehensive care that covers their basic needs, their schooling, support with their educational needs and subsequent vocational training. The house is in Salkia, adjacent to Pilkhana.



#### **BENEFICIARIES**

Anand Bhavan can accommodate **30 girls between the ages of 6 and 18** who come from families in situations of extreme poverty. Most of these families are residents of Pilkhana, while others live in more remote rural areas and others are homeless and so are living on the street in the city of Calcutta.

## ANAND BHAVAN

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- Offer a home which provides the care necessary to contribute to the psychosocial development of the girls.
- Provide a **comprehensive education** to young and adolescent girls from disadvantaged families to equip them with the necessary resources for their social integration and to improve their living conditions.

#### **PROJECTS**

#### 1. BOARD

Anand Bhavan provides a safe and caring environment in which to grow. The girls cohabit with educators and assist in the household chores. They are girls from families living in extreme poverty and have to face tough family situations. They each receive personalized attention and monitoring so that they can develop their abilities and their needs can be met, be they physical, academic, intellectual or emotional.



#### 2. HEALTH

Many of the girls grew up in very poor health and this has had serious consequences for their development. Their **basic food, clothing, hygiene and medical needs** are met in the home. They are cared for by doctors from the Pilkhana medical centre and their diet is supervised by the paediatrician from the same centre. They each receive a general annual check-up (in October in 2014) and eye examination (in March in 2014), since many of the girls have impaired vision which affects their ability to learn and their school performance. Furthermore, our gynaecologist comes to Anand Bhavan to deliver talks on health education to the girls (2 talks in 2014).



#### 3. EDUCATION

#### Formal education:

The girls attend two public schools in the area, depending on their native language (Hindi or Bengali). They also get extra tutoring in the home in Hindi and Bengali to meet their educational needs and English and computer classes to complement their training.



## ANAND BHAVAN

#### **Extracurricular activities:**

We view education in a holistic manner and an important part of this is the **teaching of moral values**. Moreover, we try to provide the girls with experiences to help them develop other skills, to experiment and create in the form of **workshops, cultural outings and excursions**. In 2014: the final sessions of the photography workshop that began the previous year; a dance workshop given by an Indian volunteer which finished with the annual event with the families; in August, leisure activities with a group of 9 Spanish volunteers; hand-washing workshop to mark the **World Health Organization's Global Hand-washing Day**; lessons in moral values conducted by the centre's director.



#### REFURBISHMENT OF THE COMPUTER ROOM

In 2014 we updated the computer room with 6 new computers, a printer and Internet connection.



#### 4. WORKING WITH THE FAMILIES

It is essential that the girls maintain contact with their families and so we try to encourage this. Families visit the girls at Anand Bhavan every other Sunday and the girls return home during holiday periods, except in cases where the families live on the street and they prefer to come visit them because of the risks involved in street living. We also work with the mothers and fathers, or the guardians,

in the case of orphaned girls, to involve them in the education of their daughters, showing them the value of education for their future and encouraging them in their role as parents.



## ANAND BHAVAN

#### **2014 OUTCOMES**

Thirty-four young and adolescent girls in 2014.

We started 2014 with 30 children who had stayed on from the previous year. Four dropped out before finishing their schooling (2 of whom were 18 years old) so 4 new girls joined. The following is the age distribution:

## GENDER EQUALITY

#### ALISHA, NILU AND CHANDANA

#### **Graduate and begin High Secondary**

In 2014, three of the girls who came to Anand Bhavan when it opened in 2006 finished secondary level, sitting the official examination (Madhyamik) for the certificate of graduation and obtaining very good results. **Chandana, Alisha and Nilu** are the first group from Anand Bhavan to graduate secondary level. They are also the first in their families to do so and, with their support, have decided to continue studying to baccalaureate level.







## WOMEN'S CRAFT WORKSHOP

#### START DATE: 2011

In September 2011 we opened the women's craft workshop thanks to the impetus of Sebastián Alcalá and his company Bordar & Co. The project has been growing ever since. In 2013 they began the process of converting it into a cooperative, obtaining its registration as an independent association under the name **Swikriti** (which in Bengali means "**recognition**") in June 2014. The project is now self-managed by the women.

They continue to work on the premises of Anand Bhavan, in a space they are given them free of charge. We also continue to assist them with management, product development and by buying their wares which we then sell in Spain.



## TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- Provide training in handicraft techniques.
- Provide the opportunity to **generate income** from their work.
- Create a space where they **feel valued and respected** and can develop as people.

#### **BENEFICIARIES**

Women living under **the poverty line**, with no access to education, who need to generate income in order to support their families.

#### **PROJECTS**

#### 1. Training workshops:

The **craft workshop** offers the possibility of taking a 10 month course focusing on the following handicraft techniques:

- Hand embroidery, which is passed from mothers to daughters.
- Batik, a textile dyeing technique with a long tradition in India, registered in 2009 on the UNESCO World Cultural Heritage List.
- Crochet



#### 2. Handicraft production team:

After completing the course, the students can join the **production team**. Women who have received their training in other centres can also join. Once incorporated into this group, the women have the opportunity to generate income from their work.



#### INTERNATIONAL FAIR TRADE NETWORK

From the beginning, the workshop has been associated with CRC (Craft Resource Centre), a Calcutta organization with extensive experience and which is part of the International Fair Trade Network. They provide various groups of handicraft workers the possibility of commercializing their products and exporting them to countries in Europe and the United States. Their support has been essential to the management of the workshop in line with the rules of Fair Trade and provides the possibility of distributing the women's products outside India.



## TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT

#### **SALES IN SPAIN**

Bordar & Co, a company directed by Sebastián Alcalá, the driving force behind our women's crafts workshop in Calcutta, has showrooms in Madrid and Barcelona. **Bordar & Co** continue to work with the workshop, providing a channel for the sale of its products in Spain and assisting with the development of new products on their visits to Calcutta.



In 2013 the workshop took a big step, joining the circuit of local Craft Fairs. In October they participated in the **Calcutta Craft Fair**, one of the largest in the state of West Bengal. The Fair also held a contest in which the best work was awarded. The work presented by the teacher of the Swati Das workshop was voted best handmade embroidery of the Fair. They also attended the National Fair of Calcutta, along with artisans from all the states around the country.



#### **OUTCOMES**

At the end of 2014, **25 women** were working in the production workshop, of which 16 had continued from the previous year and 14 had joined in 2014.



## VOLUNTEERS

### **VOLUNTEERS IN CALCUTTA 2014**

With the experience gained over the years, we have developed a volunteer programme. Operating during the month of August, it offers a limited number of people the opportunity to join the project, assisting in the day to day running of the centres in roles related to their training and experience. In 2014, nine volunteers from Madrid, Barcelona and Murcia participated in the programme.

On top of that, we were joined by volunteers from the Parish of St. Josemaria of Aravaca (Madrid) group, six of whom spent two weeks in our facility. All the volunteers attended an evening of celebration with the girls from Anand Bhavan.

Furthermore, people who actively collaborate with us in Spain and Italy came to Calcutta to meet those involved and help with the projects. Some of them wrote about their experience on our website. Here are some excerpts:





#### Father José María Herranz, founding member

(...) "For me the greatest satisfaction comes from seeing that things work. (...) A visit to Colours involves a time of reconciliation with the NGOs and their smooth operation. The projects work, the money we send from Spain is well spent and the efficacy thereof is remarkable because the people who are looked after there badly need us to continue helping them. (...) I was struck by the generosity of all those who are committed to this project and are involved in its development. In a Europe preoccupied solely and exclusively with the crisis, in a Europe in which we are all being obliged to live a little more modestly, to see a

group of people who, without being millionaires, are determined that generosity be one of their defining features reconciles with our society and with humanity. (...)"

## **VOLUNTEERS**

#### Carmen Sánchez, volunteer in Calcutta and in Spain



"My time with the babies in the unit for malnourished children allowed me to share each day a close relationship with babies diagnosed with nutritional deficiencies and in many cases with other types of deficiencies, because they are never just one. The relationship I formed with both the children and with the people who care for them has allowed me to spend time with a new reality in our society, to get to know their culture, their level of development and to respect it deeply. (...)"

"Sharing in the day to day you become aware of the enormous work involved, the daily effort to take these projects forward. Seeing those faces of the children smiling when they see you come into their space. You come to know the dreams of the creators of the project, the school, the eye clinic... Dreams that, with a little help from each of us who have so much, can come true. And I'm going home with the intention of keeping it up. To keep asking support from those around me, to keep fighting, to stay involved so that this project, with my small contribution, keeps moving forward. Because it is easy to feel part of it, because trip after trip I see that the future appears to be changing, however slowly

and because I believe that together, making life easier for the less fortunate.... it's possible."

(...) "The interview with Dr. Arjun, an Indian dentist, young but experienced and above all enthusiastic about the project. The visit to a dental depot to buy all the necessary materials and the excitement of the unknown. The same excitement of the people of Colours and all those that here in Spain have been enthusiastic about the possibility of providing a community dental service which is nonetheless safe and of good quality, to thousands of homeless people. (...) A lot to do, a lot to dream, but the strength of hope has no limits. Our target: two dental chairs working five days a week, eight hours a day. Only those who reach for the stars can get there."


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
