Dear Friends,

This annual report covers the work we have carried out in 2015. During this year the Colores de Calcuta Foundation has continued developing the projects in Calcutta (**24,932 beneficiaries in 2015**) and consolidating itself as an institution. Our work has been acknowledged with the **Award for Best Social Action in 2015 (Premio a Mejor Acción Social 2015)** granted by **MAPFRE Foundation**.

In the **medical center**, the different services have continued to offer high quality and accessible medical care to the people in the slum of Pilkhana. The **dental clinic**, which opened in 2014, has evolved positively and attended to 1,116 cases last year. This gradual growth is a result of the **health promotion** carried out from our center. Also, thanks to the support from a local donor and to the Indian Women Association for Charity de Madrid, we have been able to **renovate and maintain the main building** which was very necessary.

In **Anand Bhavan**, our shelter home for girls and adolescents, 7 girls have passed the Madhomik official test to graduate high school, and in addition to **graduates** from last year, 10 students in total. Which shows there is enthusiasm to continue their education.

This year we are publishing a photography book called "**Through the Eyes of Girls**", which contains photos taken by the girls at Anand Bhavan and has been brilliantly edited by **Petrini Foundation** (Switzerland). The book was presented at the Milan Bienalle and at the Italian Culture Institute in Madrid.

OUR STORY

Colores de Calcuta Foundation is a Spanish NGO with **a cooperation for development program** which focuses on **health and education** in the **slum of Pilkhana in Calcutta** since 2005.

Colores de Calcuta was created by **Antonio Mesas**, who arrived in Calcutta to work as a volunteer with the Missionaries of Charity and decided to stay to bring this project to life.

During the early years, he joined a group of people who formed the Association "Un Ladrillo en Calcuta" in 2005. After this they began collaborating with the Indian **NGO Seva Sangh Samiti**, founded in 1968 by the French priest Father Laborde. His life was told by the journalist Dominique Lapierre in his book "The City of Joy". To this day, they remain our local counterparts.

The first initiative that took shape was **the shelter home for girls**, Anand Bhavan, which opened in **April 2006**. A year later we began **managing a medical center** in the slum of Pilkhana and have been increasing the services provided year after year. In 2011, the latest project was started, a **Women's Handicraft Workshop**. These projects are still going on today and they make up our Cooperation for Development Program increasing services and beneficiaries every year.

In October 2009, Antonio Mesas received the **Cruz de la Orden de Isabel la Católica** granted by the Spanish Government to acknowledge his work. In 2010, the project was integrated into the Ananta Foundation under the name "Colores de Calcuta, cooperation for development project", in which during four years they reinforced the fundraising activities in Spain.

In 2013, we started a new phase by setting up the **Colores de Calcuta Foundation on December 13**. The Foundation was registered in the Ministry of Health and Social Services and Equality and as an NGOD (Non-Governmental Organization for Development) in the Spanish Agency for International Development (Agencia Española de Cooperación Internacional para el Desarrollo) in the first trimester of 2014. As a foundation, we have advanced the **sustainability of the Calcutta projects** and our consolidation as an entity.



OUR MISSION

To offer **development opportunities** to those who live in extreme poverty in order to improve their living conditions.

OUR VISION

- Working towards development means **to believe in the people**, in their ability to take action and to transform themselves once they have the necessary resources and opportunities to develop their full potential.
- We believe that **development within a community** can only happen through the development of its people and through their active participation.
- We believe childhood is the engine for development. Through **health** care and access to **education**, we aim at giving them an opportunity to develop their transformative capacity.

MAPFRE FOUNDATION AWARD FOR THE BEST SOCIAL ACTION INITIATIVE IN 2015

In June 18th, Colores de Calcuta Foundation, together with Plácido Domingo and two additional institutions from the UK and the Netherlands, was awarded one of 4 **Social Awards** granted by the **Mapfre Foundation**, out of the 450 candidates from Spain, Portugal and Latin America.

Our foundation was granted the **Award for the Best Social Action Initiative** thanks to our **Child Health Program** in the slum of Pilkhana in Calcutta. The Mapfre Foundation highlighted “the social benefit that is provided by the entity’s projects by serving the underprivileged collectives in India, mainly women and children”.



COOPERATION FOR DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM IN INDIA

Our activities are focused on the Cooperation for Development Program in Calcutta (India) which covers:

IMPLEMENTATION, MANAGEMENT, AND ONSITE EVALUATION

Colores de Calcuta Foundation has two onsite employees: Antonio Mesas, director for India (and founder of Colores de Calcuta Foundation), who is present every day and is in charge of management, supervision and follow-up. And María de Muns, director for Spain, who travels to Calcutta twice a year to develop the technical aspects of the foundation and evaluates the projects.

Local Counterpart: Seva Sangh Samiti



Seva Sangh Samiti

We collaborate with the **Indian NGO Seva Sangh Samiti**, which was set up in 1968, through Father Laborde's efforts. He was a French priest who inspired the book "The City of Joy" by Dominique Lapierre. Seva Sangh Samiti has over **48 years of experience** in the slum of Pilkhana where they began and in other parts of the city and rural areas of Calcutta (India).



The majority of the team members (**51 in total**) in charge of the projects, live in the neighborhood and have been trained accordingly to be able to carry out their work. They provide better insight into the needs of the population, better understanding of the difficulties we encounter and the relationships with the beneficiary families, and serve as a motor of development for the community. They have been joined by local professionals in different fields (health, education...) contributing to the general development.

Collaboration from Seva Sangh Samiti as a local counterpart and team work, have been key to making **a fully integrated program in the neighborhood and community today.**

SUSTAINABILITY

We work to make projects sustainable in the long term by strengthening the team´s skill-set to address the current challenges in management and funding, by promoting self-funding initiatives and fundraising in India.

FUNDING

Colores de Calcuta Foundation is the main funder of the projects within the Program. For this reason, our work in Spain is mainly focused on fundraising through the collaboration of partners, private donors and entities, and organizing activities and events all year round. We also have the collaboration of our sister organization in Milan: **Amici Colores de Calcuta Italia ONLUS, and Petrini Foundation in Switzerland.**

PILKHANA, "THE CITY OF JOY"

Calcutta, capital of the West Bengal State, has a population of approximately 15 million, which makes it one of the most populated cities in India. Many live in large slums located near industrial sites. **Our project develops in Pilkhana**, better known as "**The City of Joy**", located in Howrah, in the industrial district of Calcutta.

Pilkhana is one of the largest slums in Calcutta and it has a very poor infrastructure. It has **more than 100, 000 inhabitants who live in extreme poverty**. Many of them are immigrants coming from the West Bengal State and from the neighboring state of Bihar, who came to the city looking for work. They are **large families** who live together to try and cover all their members' needs as a response to the lack of public social coverage. Their income is low and irregular and mainly derived from temporary and unstable jobs, which sometime provide incomes **less than 1€/day**.

In addition to the **tough life conditions**, there is a poor public health system to meet the needs of such a large population. There is a **high illiteracy rate** amongst parents which has an impact on the children's raising and development. On the other hand, **public education is not free** which complicates school access for the children in the neighborhood.

PILKHANA MEDICAL CENTER COMMUNITY HEALTH PROGRAM

STARTING DATE: 2007

The Pilkhana Medical Center was started by **Seva Sangh Samiti in 1976**. Our team began collaborating with the center in **2006** when it was about to close down due to lack of resources. The **building was renovated** given that it was rundown and unsafe, and a new phase started when it was **reopened in 2007**. Since then the number of patients and services has grown year after year, slowly responding to the population's needs with the resources available. The center offers a **very valuable health service** in a district with a population of **1.5 million people**, only two public hospitals and no primary care center.

BENEFICIARIES

The medical center takes care of **children and adults of all ages** who live in the slum of Pilkhana and from other neighborhoods that are further away (Tikiapara, Belilius Road, Batra, Dasnagar), being one of the few medical centers with these characteristics in the area.

MANTAINANCE WORK AND RENOVATION OF THE BUILDING IN 2015

In 2015, the building underwent maintenance work: **painting and renovation of the interior and façade** in addition to work on the **general medicine and pediatrics department**. An independent ward was built for **private patient consultations** and the **waiting room** was changed into a multifunction room for the Health Education workshops and treatment room. **A company in Calcutta was responsible for the funding of the whole construction work** and we thank them for their collaboration.



OBJECTIVES

- To offer **high quality and accessible primary health care** that improves the general health of the people in the neighborhood.
- To work on actions to promote **prevention** focused on **health education** and **early disease detection** that can guarantee faster and more efficient treatments.

ACTIVITIES

PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

We provide high quality and accessible primary health care to the families in the community through the following departments:

1. General medicine and treatment room: From Mondays to Saturdays
2. Pneumology: Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays
3. Gynecology and obstetrics: Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays
4. Pediatrics: Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays
5. Physiotherapy: From Mondays to Fridays
6. Dental clinic: Tuesdays and Thursdays

Pharmacy:

The patients receive the **medicines prescribed by the doctors for free**, through the organization **Community Development Medical Unit**, which is specialized in sales of quality generic medicines to NGOs.

Diagnostic tests:

In some cases, we help in the **funding of diagnostic tests** for patients that are carried out in other centers in the area.

HEALTH EDUCATION WORKSHOPS

In 2015 we continued with the **Health Education Workshop Program through monthly workshops in each medical department** (5 workshops a month). These are available for all the people in the neighborhood. There are also workshops in the children's units (three workshops a month) aimed mainly at the mothers given their key role in the health of their families.

COLLABORATION WITH PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAMS

From the medical center, we collaborate with the Government's health programs provided by Medical Corporation in the Howrah's district, which depends on centers like ours to reach the population, given it does not have sufficient resources.

Tuberculosis Control Program

Tuberculosis is considered one of the **main health epidemics in India** affecting both children and adults. The medical center is part of the DOT network (Direct Observation Treatment centers) which carry out the tuberculosis control campaign promoted the Central Government. We receive the medicines for the patients in this Program from Howrah's Medical Corporation. Also, the medical center offers treatment to the patients that do not fulfill the requirements of the Program due to their type of tuberculosis.



Vaccine Campaigns

From our center, we **facilitate the vaccines** that are not provided by the public healthcare system for free, inform mothers and oversee the vaccine record cards. There are also public vaccine campaigns, **like Polio**, which are carried out by health agents who use our centers to reach the children.



DENTAL CLINIC EVOLUTION IN 2015

The **evolution of the dental clinic** which opened in August 2014, stands out in 2015. During the first months after opening, the patients arrived very gradually given it is a service they were not familiar with since there is no such department in the area for people with no resources. The patients arrived in critical conditions. The **education and awareness efforts** of the dentist have been key to make patients understand the importance of early consultations, as well as the advice from **Doctor Luis Jané (Barcelona)** who has been involved in the department since the beginning. By the end of the year there were a total of **1,116 consultations**, which is a big increase compared to the previous year.



In January we received the visit from the **Spanish Ambassador, Mr. Gustavo de Aristegui, showing his support for this initiative.**



RESULTS 2015

PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

22.395 consultations in 2015.

There has been a big consultation increase (32%) this year, in particular in the pneumology and physiotherapy departments, and in the dental clinic.

MEDICAL CENTER CASES

ARIYAN BALMIKI, cerebral palsy



Ariyan is one year old and was born with cerebral palsy. He has physiotherapy treatment in our center. When he arrived, he could only lie down. Now Ariyan is able to sit up and his legs are beginning to have the strength to support his standing. Treatment continues so he will be able to walk and improve his autonomy.

SAIRUM NISHA, palliative physiotherapy



Sairum Nisha is 65 years old. She suffers from arthritis that is aggravated by continuous malnutrition throughout her life, making movement very difficult and causing severe pain. She receives physiotherapy treatment for her disease.

MOHAMED, recovered from tuberculosis



Mohamed works as a rickshaw driver and came to our center with tuberculosis. After receiving treatment, he has recovered and can now return to work to support his family.

KARIM, work accident



Karim works in construction and suffered an accident on the job. They took care of his wounds and prevented infection in the medical center.

PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN WITH MALNUTRITION

STARTING DATE: 2007

This Program is carried out within the medical center. We began to develop it at the reopening in 2007 with a day care unit with a limited capacity of 20 places due to space limitations. In 2008, we expanded it with the implementation of the Weekly Care Program, ensuring that any child who arrives with malnutrition can receive treatment.

BENEFICIARIES

Children between 0 and 2 years of age with malnutrition.

OBJECTIVE

- To treat child malnutrition
- To reduce child mortality
- To mitigate the consequences of malnutrition in the child's development

ACTIVITIES

1. Day unit for children with malnutrition:

With a capacity of about 20 children, priority is given to children who arrive with severe malnutrition or with an extreme family situation that makes it difficult for them to receive adequate treatment from home. Some cases require prior hospitalization due to the severity of the condition. At the unit they receive care from Monday to Friday from 10.00 to 15.30. They are under the supervision of two nurses and three caregivers. In addition, mothers are given infant formula for home feedings.

2. Weekly Care Program:

Children come once a week for pediatric review, weight monitoring and are given infant formula for the entire week.



COMPREHENSIVE TREATMENT FOR MALNUTRITION

The treatment lasts from the time the child arrives until approximately 2 years of age. The comprehensive treatment consists of:

1. Medical care: Detection and monitoring by the medical team (pediatrician and nurses).

2. Nutrition: Breast milk is an irreplaceable food for feeding the baby in the first stage of life, and in the Malnutrition Program we favor breastfeeding. However, in many cases breastfeeding is not sufficient because the mother suffers from malnutrition, so it is necessary to combine breastfeeding with baby formula feedings. As the child grows, the mother is given guidelines for the gradual introduction of solid food.

3. Physiotherapy treatment: Malnutrition affects the development of the child, especially psychomotor development. That is why all children requiring it receive treatment in the physiotherapy unit of the medical center.

4. Health Education and parenting guideline workshops for mothers: Monthly workshops are held and parenting topics (breastfeeding, vaccination, nutrition, hygiene, etc.) are addressed. The goal is for mothers to learn to care for their children and to take responsibility in their role of raising the child and to prevent the child from becoming malnourished again after treatment.



OVERCOMING MALNUTRITION

MD ARSAD

Four-month-old Md Arsad arrived in July 2013 with severe malnutrition. He entered the day unit and received treatment for more than two years, recovering his health and becoming a very cheerful child. In December, he was discharged and joined the Nursery in January 2016.



NADIA KHATOON

Four-month-old Nadia came to the day unit in January 2015 with severe malnutrition. Her evolution was very positive during the year, although her treatment in the unit will continue during the next year until she recovers completely.



RESULTS 2015

This year 120 children were treated. Since 2014, in which **111 children** were cared for, there has been no significant increase. The **7 children who were discharged from the Malnutrition unit** joined our Nursery in January of this year.

PRESCHOOL: Preschool Education

The Nursery (day care center) is located inside the medical center and was launched in 2007 with the reopening of the center.

REFORM WORKS IN THE NURSERY

In 2015, windows were installed to prevent rain and cold from entering in the winter months. The works were financed by the Madrid Indian Women's Association for Charity, to whom, once again, we thank for their support.



BENEFICIARIES

Boys and girls from 2 to 5 years. The Nursery has **40 places**. In the selection process of children, those who have finished treatment in the Malnutrition Program and those who do not have available care during the day have priority, avoiding their being on the street.

OBJECTIVES

- To provide basic care for the child's overall health: **nutrition, hygiene, medical care.**
- To provide **preschool education** that contributes to psychosocial development and prepares them for later schooling.
- To facilitate **schooling** beginning at 5 years of age.

ACTIVITIES

The children attend the Nursery from Monday to Friday from 10.00h to 15.30h. The activities that are carried out aim to provide comprehensive care that contributes to the development of each child.

1. HEALTH:

Hygiene: children do not have toilets or running water in their homes. For this reason, they shower every day when they arrive at the Nursery to maintain proper hygiene.

Nutrition: 3 meals a day, breakfast, lunch and snack. The diet is supervised by the pediatrician to cover basic nutritional needs according to age.



Medical care: The Nursery is located inside the medical center, and the children receive the attention of the center's pediatrician and nurses.

Yoga classes and physiotherapy: twice a week the children have yoga class, which contributes to their psychomotor development. In addition, children who require it receive individual treatment in the physiotherapy department.



2. PRESCHOOL EDUCATION:

The Nursery is divided into two classes, depending on the age group: 2-3 years and 3-4 years, and follow a simple educational program with activities that contribute to the development of the child. Twice a year we take the children to the zoo or the botanical garden to encourage contact with nature, since there are no parks within the neighborhood, and children do not have an open space to play.



3. FACILITATING SCHOOLING:

We work with families to raise awareness about the value of education for their children. When the child reaches the age of 5 (school age), the families are helped with the admission process to neighborhood public schools. In addition, funding the first year of school is provided through a school scholarship, which covers the expenses of matriculation, uniform, and books.



4. MOTHERS TRAINING:

Once a month, group sessions taught by teachers, nurses and doctors are held for the mothers. Health issues and the importance of education for the development of children is addressed.



RESULTS 2015

In January 2015, six nursery children were enrolled in different schools in the neighborhood and seven children from the Malnutrition unit were integrated after completing the Program.

After two years in the day unit of the Program for Children with Malnutrition, Sabnam joined the Nursery in January this year, where she plays and learns with her peers.



AYSHA PARVEEN

Aysha came to the Malnutrition Program in 2011 at 5 months of age. At 2 years old and completely recovered, she went to the Nursery for two years. In 2015 she started in the neighborhood school.



ANAND BHAVAN

Shelter home for girls and adolescents

STARTING DATE: 2006

Anand Bhavan, which in Bengali means “the house of joy”, is a shelter home that has been in operation since April 2006. It provides children and adolescents a safe environment to grow and develop, providing comprehensive care that covers their basic needs, schooling, and support that responds to their educational needs and subsequent professional training. The house is located in the neighborhood of Salkia, adjacent to the slum of Pilkhana.

**COLLABORATION WITH ROCA-PARRYWARE**

In October, we signed an agreement with Roca-Parryware for the renovation of the toilets of Anand Bhavan and the Medical Center. The work began in December and concluded the following year.

BENEFICIARIES

Anand Bhavan has **30 resident places for girls and adolescents** from families living in extreme poverty in different parts of Calcutta, in urban and rural contexts. Living together in this home are girls from different religions: Hindu, Muslim and Christian. In 2015, the girls who lived in Anand Bhavan were between the ages of 4 and 19.



OBJECTIVES

- To provide a home that **provides protection**, meets their **basic needs** and contributes to their psychosocial development.
- To provide a **comprehensive education** to equip them with the necessary resources for their social integration and improve their living conditions.



ACTIVITIES

1. HOME

Anand Bhavan provides a secure and caring environment for growth, where girls live with incharges. They are girls from families living in extreme poverty and are faced with harsh family situations. Each child receives individualized attention and monitoring, so that she can develop her abilities and to respond to her needs, whether physical, academic, intellectual or emotional.



2. HEALTH

Many of the girls have experienced a very precarious state of health in their early years, which sometimes has serious consequences in their development. The home covers their basic food, clothing, hygiene, and medical needs. The health of the girls is taken care of by the different specialists of the medical center in Pilkhana.



3. EDUCATION

Formal education:

The girls go to two public schools in the neighborhood, depending on their native language (Hindi or Bengali). Due to overpopulation in the area and the insufficient public education resources, the school day has a very limited schedule. Therefore, in the house they receive extra classes in Hindi and Bengali to respond to their educational needs, as well as English and computer classes to complement their training.



After school activities:

We understand education in a holistic way. An important part of this training is education in values. On the other hand, we try to give them experiences with which they can develop other skills, where they can experiment and create through workshops, cultural outings and excursions.



In 2015 the girls attended several concerts, went to the circus and to the amusement park. As in each December, they celebrated the end of the course with their families, who prepared for several months in advance with dance and theater workshops.



FIRST COPY OF THE BOOK "THROUGH THE EYES OF GIRLS" IN ANAND BHAVAN

In January, Adriana Ornaghi Petrini (Petrini Foundation), publisher of the book "Through the Eyes of Girls", visited Anand Bhavan to deliver the first published copy. This book is a collection of photographs that the girls took in a photography workshop for 6 months.



4. WORK WITH FAMILIES

It is essential for the girls to keep in touch with their families, so we work to promote this bond. Families visit the girls in Anand Bhavan on alternate Sundays, and during the holiday periods the girls return home, except in cases where the families live on the street, because of the risk involved. We also work with mothers and fathers (or guardians, in the case of orphan girls) to integrate them into the education of their daughters, instilling in them the value of education for their future, and reinforcing their role as parents.



TEN STUDENTS IN HIGH SECONDARY

In 2015, seven students finished High Secondary by passing the Madhomik official examination, obtaining their first official study certificate, and being the first in their families to have this degree. Including those who obtained it last year, there are ten girls in total who attended High Secondary this year.



RESULTS 2015

We started 2015 with 30 girls continuing their education. During this year three girls left: one after graduating school, and two dropped out before finishing secondary. In their place, three new girls were enrolled to begin their schooling.

WOMEN'S HANDICRAFT WORKSHOP

STARTING DATE: 2011

In September 2011, we inaugurated this handicraft workshop aimed at women with a lack of resources and due to lack of training and their family situation, find it very difficult to find an income generating job to support their families. From its beginning and continuing to today we have had the support of Sebastián Alcalá and his company **Bordar & Co**, which has experience in initiatives like this in other countries.

In June 2014, the workshop went one step further by registering as a **cooperative** with the name of **Swikriti**, which in Bengali means **recognition**. Since then it is a self-managed project. The women work within the facilities of Anand Bhavan, in space that is given to them rent free. The Colores de Calcuta Foundation also provides support in management, development of new products and by purchasing produced articles that we sell in Spain at our events and markets.



OBJECTIVES

- To provide **professional training** in craft techniques.
- To provide a **job opportunity** for income generation.
- To create a space where they feel valued and respected, and **they can thrive**.



BENEFICIARIES

Women living below the poverty line who need to generate income to support their families.

ACTIVITIES

1. Training workshops:

The artisan workshop offers the possibility of a 10-month training course focused on the following craft techniques:

- Sewing
- Hand embroidery
- Batik, a textile dyeing technique with a long tradition in India, registered in 2009 by UNESCO as World Cultural Heritage
- Crochet



2. Handicraft production group:

After finishing the course, the students have the possibility of joining the production group. It also admits women who have received their training in other centers. Once they join this group, women have the opportunity to generate income from their work.



INTERNATIONAL TRADE NETWORK

From the outset, the workshop has partnered with **CRC (Craft Resource Center)**, a Calcutta organization with extensive experience. It is a member of the International Fair Trade Network, which enables different groups of artisans to market their products and export them to European countries and the United States. Having its support has been essential for the management of the workshop according to Fair Trade criteria and in turn provides the possibility of distributing the artisan products outside India.



SALES IN SPAIN

Bordar&Co continues to collaborate with this workshop by facilitating a channel for the sale of its products in Spain, and with the development of new products with periodic visits to Calcutta. It has showrooms in Madrid and Barcelona. In addition, Colores de Calcuta Foundation buys the products produced in the workshop for sale in our markets in Spain, and proceeds are used to finance the projects.

PARTICIPATION IN LOCAL FAIRS

Since 2013, the artisan workshop is part of the network of local artisans and participates in Craft Fairs sponsored by the public administration. In November, they participated for the third year in a row in the West Bengal State Craft Fair, and in December at the Calcutta Handicraft Fair.



RESULTS 2015

In 2015 the workshop has made very positive progress in the production process, both in meeting deadlines and in product quality.

VOLUNTEERING IN CALCUTTA 2015

During the month of August, we carried out a **Volunteer Program** in Calcutta which offered volunteers the opportunity to be a part of the projects by joining the day-to-day running of the centers in support tasks related to their training and experience.

In 2015, nine volunteers from Madrid, Barcelona and Bilbao participated in our Volunteer Program. They collaborated in the Malnutrition unit, day care, and in activities with the girls of Anand Bhavan.

This year we also had three volunteers from the Laredo volunteer team, Chema Lastra, Quique Fernández and Juan Carlos González. They were coordinated by Tinuca Revolvero, and they collaborated with their experience in the physiotherapy department, the dental clinic and with photography to share their experiences with the Laredo collaborators.



The volunteers wanted to share their experience. Here are some snippets:

Ana Lago Rivaya

"Attending an admission interview of a mother and her malnourished baby was one of the things that impacted me the most during my volunteer trip with Colores de Calcuta. When a small, 3-month-old baby weighing less than 3 kilos arrived at the medical center of the slum of Pilkhana, I was face to face with reality. (...) The mother, a twenty-year-old with a two-year-old son, had traveled several hours to get to the center by public transport. Although she seemed to have some milk, her baby no longer had the strength to suck, a concern that had made her go to the center, as she watched her baby waste away every day.



The baby could not be admitted to the center at that time because he was very weak and was referred to the emergency room of one of the hospitals in Calcutta until he gained some weight (not all children succeed). Later, these children can enter the Malnutrition Unit of the medical center maintained by the Colores de Calcuta Foundation, either in the day unit or with the Weekly Program, where mothers receive infant formula to feed their children (...).

Pilar Banegas

"I always felt the need to do something like this and finally at 52 I was able to fulfill my dream. I believed, naive of me, that I was going to help work and give something of myself. I was wrong. I got back more than I could ever think possible. (...) What I liked the most is the immense respect that they give to the way of life, culture and customs of all the people who benefit from Colores de Calcuta and to the local workers who, day by day, move the project forward, in my opinion a clear example of cooperation for development.



Both at Pilkhana Medical Center and Anand Bhavan I was with very special children and I witnessed first person their progress and their enthusiasm for life and for being happy. I have lived and collaborated with the local workers and learned from them their enthusiasm for their work, an enthusiasm I took with me along with their great friendship.

Behind all this, there is the hard work done by Colores for all these years, and being, as I am, a health professional, I realize the immense effort that has been made to achieve what they have now, with the resources available to them. I don't think I can express the great admiration I felt when I learned this. (...). "

Colores de Calcuta Foundation organizes events with profits destined for the financing of our activities. We thank many different entities and collaborators for their support in 2015.

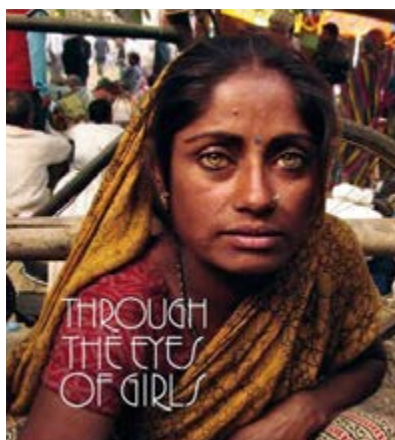
ASSOCIAZIONE CULTURALE NASCHIRA

"Through the Eyes of Girls" is a photography book by the Petrini Foundation (Switzerland), publisher of the book, in collaboration with the Colores de Calcuta Foundation. It is the result of a workshop conducted for **30 girls and adolescents** living in Anand Bhavan, our shelter home in Calcutta. For 6 months, they participated in a **photography workshop** where they learned to use a camera for the first time with 3 professional Indian photographer (Asis Kumar Sanyal, Jayanta Saha, Kushal Gangopadhyay). This book collects the photographs that they took of the streets of their city, their neighborhood, their families and their daily life.

After two years of work, in 2015 the Petrini Foundation presented its publication: a **magnificently edited book** designed in Italy with the collaboration of photographer Luigi Gattinara di Zubiena and publisher Gioia Guerzoni.

100% of the proceeds from the sale of the book will go to the **Anand Bhavan shelter**, where the young photographers reside.

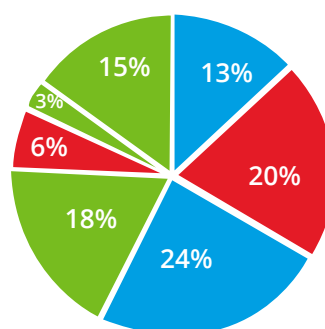
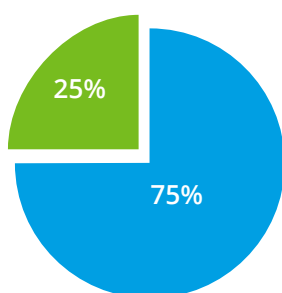
